

Spirit of North County Volleyball Game Rules and Information

“A” Rules (as found in your Catholic Youth Council Archdiocese of St. Louis 2010 Volleyball Rulebook) will be played.

Free substitution will be used.

No more than two (2) boys on the court at any given time.

No more than one (1) boy on the front line at any given time.

First team to 25 points will be considered the winner of said game, unless playing on so as to allow either team to win by two (2) points or by one (1) point with a cap of 27 points.

Rally scoring will be used in each game.

The first game will begin at 9:00 a.m.

The second game will begin at 9:30 a.m.

The third game will begin at 10:00 a.m.

All subsequent games will begin five (5) minutes after the completion of the preceding game. Please exit the court after your game to allow teams to warm-up.

Lunch will be served to the players and coaches as games are being played. The tournament will not stop to take a lunch break; those teams not playing can eat lunch as they are waiting. Those teams playing can eat lunch upon completion of their game.

The two (2) teams that win the most games will proceed to the Championship match.

The Championship match will consist of best two out of three games.

One (1) point is given to a team for each game that it wins. The two (2) teams with the most points will advance to the Championship match.

If a tiebreaker match is needed to determine the two (2) teams advancing to the Championship match, all 3 games (or 2 out of 3) will be rally scoring with 15 points being the required number of points needed to win the game unless playing on so as to allow either team to win by two (2) points or by one (1) point with a cap of 17 points.

COED VOLLEYBALL RULES

When the ball is played more than once by a team, a female player shall make at least one of the contacts. Contact of the ball during blocking shall not constitute playing the ball. There is no requirement for a male player to contact the ball, regardless of the number of hits by a team.

If a team contacts the ball more than one time during offensive action, one of the contacts must be by a female player, but there is no restriction preventing all three team hits from being made by female players. Contact of the ball during blocking action does not count as one of the three team hits. Therefore, after a block, a male player may play the ball back over the net as such contact would be considered the first team hit. A ball contacted more than once by a team, without a female player having contacted it, remains live and does not become an illegal hit until it fully crosses the plane of the net or is contacted by an opponent. An illegally hit ball blocked by an illegal blocker results in a double fault, and a play over is directed.

These rules/information are subject to change on game day based on the amount of available "Gym time" given to us and the amount of time used throughout the day.
